Then they will be placed above the high tide line in places where Mena the penguin dog has found nesting sites, between Collingwood and Puponga.

Enviroschools

The week before last we made kale chips - a firm favourite of the Envirocouncil - and shared them around the whole school. However, as an easy nutritious snack or an interesting side dish to a meal they are a winner!

Kale is easy to grow, especially in winter - when it doesn't get eaten by caterpillars - and provides rich nutritious greens. It is also great raw in salads or smoothies!

KALE CHIPS

- 1 small bunch of kale
- 1 tablespoon of oil - olive or rice bran
- Salt and pepper

Turn oven to 200 degrees.

Chop kale into rough pieces, around 3cm, discarding stalks.

Toss in oil and add salt and pepper.

Lay kale in a thin layer on an oven tray.

Roast in the oven for around 10-15 minutes until crispy, tossing once halfway through.
