IMPORTANT POINTS TO NOTE:

1. Competitors are restricted to **one animal per category please**. If you have entered more than one animal category, it is your responsibility to get between them as quickly as possible. The care of your animals is your responsibility and you must check on your animal throughout the day. The emphasis of the Show is on the care and handling demonstrated by the child, not the breed of the animal. **Pets should not be taken away from the designated areas.**
2. **All exhibits in the hall and pets** must have a small square card (as shown below) attached to exhibits with the front side showing, but in a way that the reverse is easily accessible for those recording names and results. Cards will be available when setting up exhibits or from the office the day before. For example:
